MINUTES OF MEETING HELD ON THE 9<sup>TH</sup> APRIL, 2022  
AT THE SPORTS PAVILLION, ST BRIDES MAJOR

  2. POLICE REPORT – Apologies received from PC Jamie Williamson as he is working away. He arranged for a colleague to produce a report. This was reported as 17 recorded crimes, but some of which are for the Wick and Ewenny areas. The one relating to the St. Brides Major Community Council are:-

6.1BUDGET REVIEW – Taking last year's account into consideration we were left with £33,800 and this year £36,700 having spent £7,000 on the Ogmores by Sea Village Hall. The walls around the burial ground are still to be completed with the first section having been completed and paid for with £1,000 per annum budgeted for this and no work having been carried out in previous years.

There is a budget of £5,000 been put aside for the Jubilee Celebration and this may have to be increased in time. So far, the spending has been:-

£500 to purchase a beacon

£500 to purchase marque

£780 on Bands.

Review on budgets to take place in May/June meeting. With a reduction in the Precept and projects which need to be undertaken the figures should be acceptable. Tree work to be carried out in the Autumn and contractors to be contacted and quotations received.

## 7. REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT

- a. BURIAL GROUND – Nothing to report.
- b. TASK AND FINISH GROUP, OGMORE BY SEA – This Group has not met recently, but will re commence after the local elections. Stewart Edwards has agreed to stay on and help if requested. APNR to be installed but at present, the part of the equipment is unavailable. Once installed the charging will be amended to:-
  - £1 for first hour
  - £2 for second hour
  - £4 for up to four hours
  - £6 for additional exceeding this.

Season tickets can be purchased £50 per annum

Car park will be open from 7am to 11pm every day with a fine of £70 to be charged outside these hours

The Task and Finish Group was established in 2019 and it is felt that this will be a big achievement for the Group.

7.3 JUBILEE CELEBRATION – Good progress has been made, Neil Smurthwaite is keeping the progress monitored.

The Church has offered that the toilets can be available on that day and with those, and the Pavilion and Three Golden Cups toilets may not be an issue, but this is to be further investigated.

Marque has been purchased.

Bands booked.

Raffle organised.

Stalls organised.

One issue to be raised in the Organising meeting, will be the hire of a children's entertainer.

Banners, piper, and music organised.

7.4 20 Miles per hour – No figures are available for this, and the item is to be removed from the agenda. It is now felt that the Vale Council/Welsh Government should now be contacted regarding placing a speed reduction in both Ogmre by Sea Village and Ogmre by Sea itself. This would prevent injuries and deaths to sheep and avoid any serious damage to vehicles and ultimately, deaths. This is to be discussed when the new council is formed. In the meantime, Vale Cllr. Stewart Edwards will approach the Vale for a reduction in the speed limit to 30 miles per hour.

8. REPORT ON BENCHES – Cllr. James stated that a review has been undertaken and found the many benches, are in a solid condition, but that work should be carried out to in fill where the ground has eroded. Mark Stevens has agreed to undertake this work. This was confirmed by the other members of the Council. There is one bench which needs replacing in Southerndown. A request has been received for a memorial bench to position there and it was agreed that the family would be asked for a £75 donation towards this, and they could then purchase a plaque to commemorate their family member.

9. BATHING WATER REVIEW – Clerk has made enquiries with the Welsh Water and Vale Council regarding this and has been advised it is the responsibility of the Natural Resources Wales and a response to an email is awaited. It was stated that the Pen-y-Bont Life Saving Group train in this water. It was agreed that Alun Cairns be involved.
