1. Welcome and Apologies

3. Police Matters

Ten reported crimes in the ward. Four criminal damage, two each for harassment and public order and one each for a dog out of control and assaulting a Police Officer. The Police had also received a request for information on an individual under "Clair's Law" (Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme)

A number of issues were raised with PC Williamson regarding parking on pavements in St Brides in the vicinity of the Fox Public House and on Slon Lane from customers to the Ogmore Village Hall. PC Williamson will monitor the situation.

H Morris asked what area of the SW Police does the St Brides ward come under due to its proximity to Bridgend. PC Willaimson replied that for operational issues we come under the jurisdiction of Barry Police.

4. Minutes of previous meeting: 10th March 2025

The minutes were accepted as a true record of the meeting.

5. Matters Arising

5.1 Sports Pavillion: No update as to the pavilion building.

A request had been received from a constituent requesting information regarding the possible purchase of a piece of land between their house and the corner of the pavilion field. As the land was the responsibility of the VOGC, Councilor C Stallard agreed to provide the necessary contact information to the constituents to pursue their interest.

- **5.2 Defibrillators:** All defibrillators are now fully registered and batteries replaced where necessary.
- **5.3 Annual Report:** The Community Council's Annual Report has been shortlisted in the OVW Annual Awards Conference. The Chair and Deputy Chair will attend on behalf of the Council.
- **5.4 Cattle Grid Handles:** The Chair asked C Stallard to bring forward a solution by the next meeting if possible. If not then the Chair will arrange to remove the handles causing a problem.
- **5.VE Day Celebrations:** A number of the previous actions have been completed. Quotes for poster printing and possible photographer attendance will be progressed. Posters will be put up in the Church, local Pubs, Notice Boards and Church Hall.
- **5.6 VOCG Removal of Bins:** Following feedback to the VOGC, the Vale Council are reviewing a number of bin locations within the constituency. Can any evidence (photographs) be sent to the Vale Council where evidence of abuse is seen.

There is now a Litter Picking Hub in the Ogmore Village Hall where equipment to aid litter picking is available for loan. This service is also available via Cllr Edwards in St Brides Major.

The condition of the bus shelters was raised with regard to the ongoing maintenance. It was agreed that Clr Stephens would investigate the options and feedback to the full Council.

13.3 St Brides Major

Concern raised by the Headteacher of St Brides School of the condition of a private sloping wall alongside the lane through which children from the school walk when arriving and leaving on the school bus. VOGC Stallard to investigate ownership/responsibility.

Public comments were received surrounding the volume and speed of road traffic through St Brides and the safety of children and older people crossing the road. Background information was provided by the Chair and VOGC Councilors on previous attempts to provide a Pelican Crossing.
